Ottawa Real Estate Market Update

Low Inventory Drives Demand

At the start of 2021 the Ottawa Real Estate Board had 622 residential homes listed on the MLS system. A year ago on January 1, 2020 that number was 1525. A decrease of 59.2% *.

New Splash Pad at Kaladar Park



The sheer excitement of children at the Kaladar Park splash pad is about to grow. The park will be seeing a new accessible splash pad implemented that has more than double the spray posts for double the fun, with a connection to an accessible pathway via Traverse Drive.

The previous splash pad will be properly decommissioned, and turned into a shaded seating area near the rocks and mature trees for community use. The details are still being finetuned but with a bigger splash pad, and new shaded seating area the park will be able to accommodate more families, and it will be accessible to all!
